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## Student Speakers

## Robin Grantner(Nursing graduate)

- Main concern is for Norsingstudents who are currently licenced and called back to clinical duties. This has meant their study leaves have been cancelled.
- School has been very receptive to their asks.

## AlannaBouffard (Nursing undergraduate)

- A lot of student stress with workload; udent nurses ecalled to work fulltime, adapting to online format or moving across country to be back with families.
- One mitigation strategy: S/U grading.
- The nursing faculty continues to find other ways to address student stress, with directated from students.

#### RamiHabib (Medicine):

- Medical students included in conversation from day 1 helped reduce stress.
  - o MED 1 are glad to continue in the online format, though the increased screen time isn't easy to adapt to.
  - o MED2, adapting to online format, some parts of TCP won't make the online transition; stress about summer vacation and clerkship.
