

Some applicants whose academigrees and Standing entitle them to serious consideration for admission to graduate studies abe considered inadequately prepared in the subject selected may be admitted to a Qualifying Program for sa Timesterdegraduate-leel courses to be text in a Qualifying Program will be prescribed by the department concerned.

Qualifying students are gestered in graduate studies to as candidates of a degree Only one Qualifying year (i.e., twfull-time terms) is permitted.
